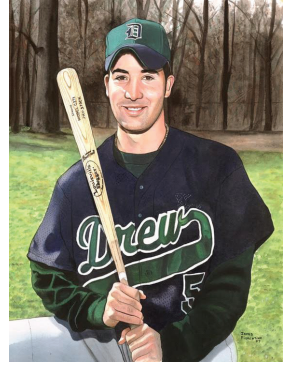


JAMES FIORENTINO

They formed their production company, Bongiorno Productions, in their home city of Newark, NJ, and screen their films and lecture extensively, often focusing on their Italian American experience.
